
Indus Hospital & Health Network

A journey that started in 2007 with a 150-bed multidisciplinary hospital in the urban slum of Korangi, Karachi, is now one of the largest healthcare providers in Pakistan. IHHN is now a network of multiple tertiary and secondary care hospitals, physical rehabilitation centres, regional blood centres, container-based community health centres, and public health programmes spread across Pakistan. Being the nation's first paperless and cashless hospital, IHHN is delivering free healthcare to all in need.

Anchored in the institutional vision of offering excellence in healthcare that is free for all, IHHN's mission is driven by the desire to serve humanity. Every year, IHHN ensures alignment of its overarching strategic goals with its work by serving the vulnerable and ensuring the community's well-being. Each year, the network caters to over 6 Million people, offering indiscriminate service to all who walk through its doors.











The network is executing a large-scale expansion of its health facilities to ensure accessibility to high-quality care by planning an inter-connected network of owned hospitals and a network of secondary-care facilities by leveraging public-private partnerships.

IHHN has strategically organised its primary care sites using a hub-and-spoke model, coupled with continuous community engagement and outreach initiatives. This thoughtfully designed approach facilitates smooth referrals to the existing secondary and tertiary hospitals within the Network, ensuring a seamless continuum of care for all the patients. To bolster these levels of care, IHHN has extended its service beyond the traditional tiered model through a diverse array of institutions. This includes Blood Transfusion Services, Laboratories, the Indus University of Health Sciences, and the Office of Research, Innovation & Commercialisation, all working in concert to enhance the overall healthcare experience.







Beyond Treatment: Indus Kay Sitary




Physical Rehabilitation

In the mosaic of healthcare endeavours, IHHN's Physical Rehabilitation Programme stands tall as a beacon of empowerment, offering a lifeline to those grappling with physical disabilities across Pakistan. Established in 2015 through a collaborative effort with the Red Cross and Chal Foundation, our patient-centred and state-of-the-art Physical Rehabilitation Centre (PRC) in Karachi paved the way for transformative change. Witnessing the pressing need for such services, IHHN extended its reach, founding three additional PRCs in Lahore, Muzaffargarh, and Badin.

Across Pakistan, the prevalence of disability remains alarmingly high, impacting countless lives and hindering individuals' ability to lead fulfilling and independent lives.




A Ray of Hope


Empowering Communities, Enriching Lives: Unveiling the Impact of the Primary Care Programme at IHHN










A Multisectoral Approach to Community Development






Horizon Widened: Unveiling the Karachi Expansion Programme at Indus Hospital & Health Network

Since 2017, The Indus Hospital, Korangi Campus, has evolved remarkably from a 150-bed hospital to a thriving 300-bed multidisciplinary healthcare facility. Despite this growth, the escalating demand for quality healthcare consistently exceeds the available supply, with an annual 40% increase in patient volumes. To address this pressing need, IHHN is embarking on the Karachi Expansion project, a strategic initiative aimed at enhancing healthcare accessibility and meeting the rising demand for exceptional medical services in the region.
